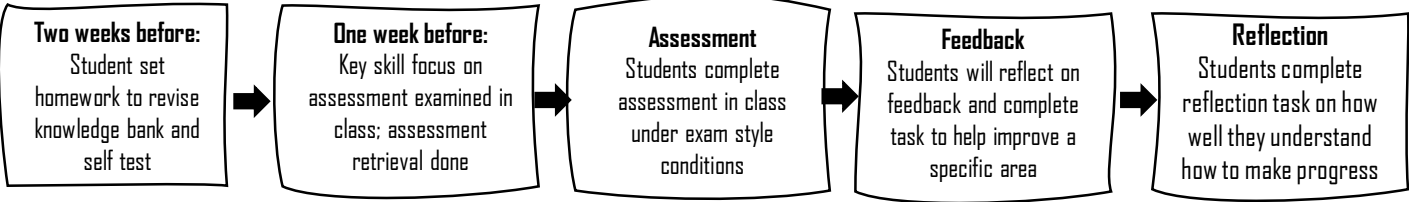

- Can you explain what you need to do to make further progress in Year 8?

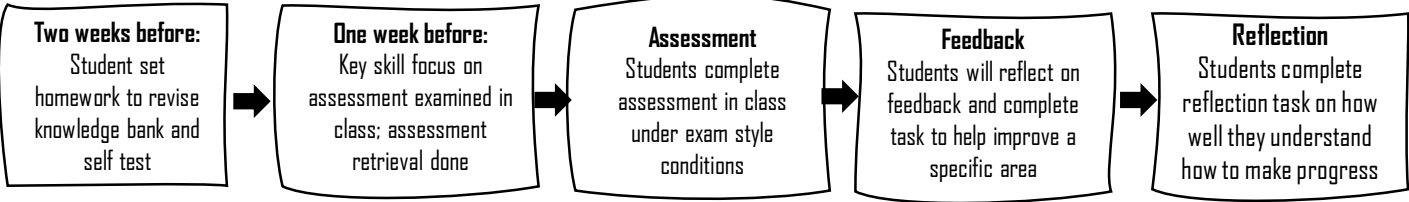
Aims for Year 10
