



Black History Month

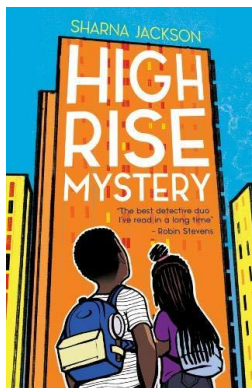
1st – 31st October

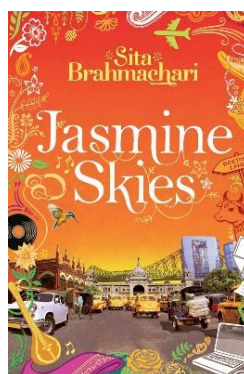
HIGH RISE MYSTERY

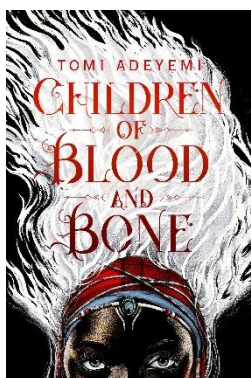
BECOMING

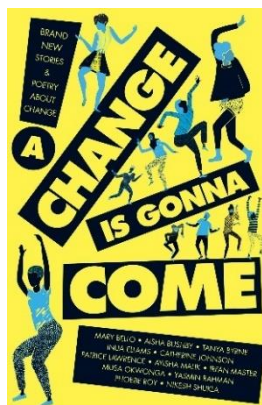
JASMINE SKIES

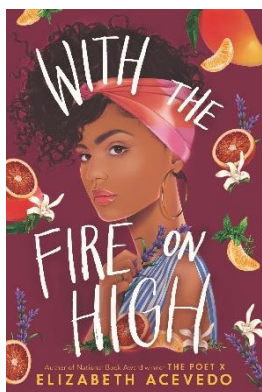
CHILDREN OF BLOOD AND BONE

A teenage girl strives to bring back magic to her people and overthrow the King that had all the Maji killed, including her mother...



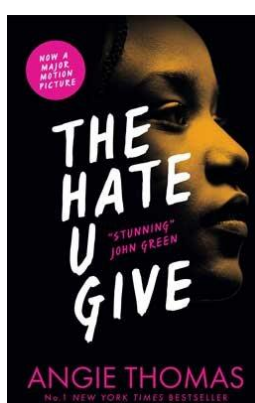
A CHANGE IS GONNA COME
