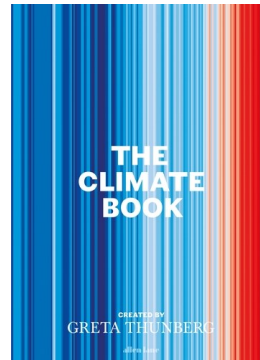
# Earth Day 22nd April 2023



Earth Day is an annual event to help raise awareness of the importance of protecting our planet and it's natural resources. Below are a selection of books from our Library and some links to online climate change articles.



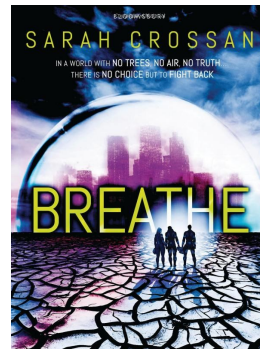

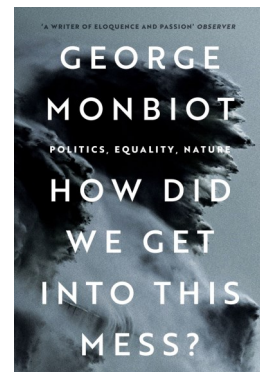
