## Site update

You will know from my letter earlier this term that our courts are currently out of action due to a subsidence issue. We are working hard in the background to find a solution to this and are in the process of planning a way forward. In a recent development, engineers have informed us that three of the trees near the courts will likely become unsafe as a consequence of the planned works. As a result, we may need to remove them to keep students, staff and contractors safe. We also have ash trees that have suffered from die back along the St Lawrence Road part of our site that will need to be removed. Please be assured that our tree surgeons will work closely with the local authority throughout the whole process and will only remove trees where it is necessary. Our site will retain its current feel and we will continue to enjoy seeing the many trees on site for years to come.

## Christmas appeal

For the second year running, we will be collecting Christmas Boxes for the Ukraine appeal. The idea is that donations from our school family will go directly to families suffering as a result of the conflict. Tutors have informed students of the appeal so your child may well discuss this with you. If you would like to contribute a shoebox of presents, the deadline is the end of October.
