Mobile phones

There will also be a general options talk during the evening. We look forward to seeing year 9 students and their parents/carers at the event.

Sparx maths change of hand-in day

The maths team have changed the setting and handing-in day for Sparx maths for 2024. Sparx maths will now be set every Tuesday with the hand in day the following Tuesday. The deadline time each Tuesday will be after the maths Tuesday lunchtime help club, Top Up Tuesday. The idea is that if a student has a problem with a question on their homework that they could not resolve by using the online videos or other resources available to them, they can get some last minute support before the deadline. The expectation is that students complete every question every week and that they achieve 100%. Questions are set based on the work students are currently

learning or have recently learnt and are matched to each student's individual ability. Sparx maths success rates at Plymouth High are consistently amongst the highest in the country and we thank you for your support in helping our students make the best possible progress in maths.
