Dear Parents and Carers

I hope this finds you well.

Work to take place on the courts

I wanted to keep you updated on the work that is planned to take place on the courts over the coming weeks.

Today, 19th January, we will be having a site meeting with our contractors and some military staff concerning the risk of finding any WWII ordinance and a review of radar absorbing materials. An appropriate risk assessment will be created to ensure that everyone is kept safe.

22nd January, we anticipate that the contractor site office and welfare unit will be put in place outside the school boundary on Alton Road. From this point staff and students will not be able to use the Alton Rd gate for entry or exit.

22nd January, we hope to move our outside catering unit, Bertha's, to the new location in the old car park opposite the Technology classrooms.













29th January, we will conduct a health and safety review of the site with our contractors to confirm that we can continue with the works and if it's safe to do so. Heavy plant will be moved onto the school site.

On January 29th we are likely to have a vehicle on the school site with *Bomb disposal team* written on the side. This is not because we are concerned that there is an unexploded WWII bomb on site, it is just that statutory requirements mean the appropriate team must be present in such excavations so that all proper measures and precautions are taken regardless of what is uncovered.

30th January, the dig starts. (This will be a series of exploratory holes to ascertain the extent of the subsequent work). The project window will be 4 days, but is dependent on decisions made at the various meetings held beforehand.

We are hopeful that Berthas will be operational in its new location by 29th January, but this will be weather dependent.
