## **Courts update**

We have what looks like some good news about the courts. The geophysicists who have been surveying the site and overseeing the exploratory digs have been able to confirm that the courts are not likely to collapse as was first feared. This means that some patch repairs can be made and the courts put back in action. We will continue our efforts to have a new surface laid across the courts, but we will be able to plan for this work to take place minimising the impact on our young people. I do not have a time scale yet for the patch repairs or the new surface, but I am hopeful that we will have the courts back in action very soon.
