Dear Parents and Carers

I do hope this finds you well.

Our 150 birthday plans are now well underway. All students and staff have been given a 150 commemorative pin badge to wear to school. Wearing the badge represents a wonderful way to celebrate the longevity of our school and is also something special to keep. ## Technology lessons in years 7 to 9

As part of the Key stage 3 Technology curriculum your child will experience working with resistant materials, using graphic design software and sewing with various textiles. The technology department would like to request a voluntary contribution of £5.00 towards covering the cost of some of the materials that will be used in the projects that students undertake. By asking for such contributions, it enables us to buy in bulk plywood, acrylic and textiles and therefore receive larger discounts with suppliers. Students are of course able to take all finished products home at the end of each project.
