I hope this finds you well.

Courts update

We are nearly at the end of the engineering and geology investigations that have been undertaken on our courts/playground. We have some good news. The engineers have confirmed that the structure is safe and is not in danger of further collapse. We are now in the process of preparing for the exploration pits to be back filled and resurfaced and the whole site cleaned and prepared for use. Unfortunately, this whole process is neither a quick or inexpensive task, but there is now light at the end of the tunnel. I will update you when we have more news, but I am hopeful that this will be soon.

Health behaviour survey

We are planning to use a national survey in school to collect information about year 8 and year 10 health behaviours during the week beginning the 18th March.

Our school, along with several others in the city, has agreed to participate in a very important Health Behaviour Survey amongst young people. We have been asked to support the work of the Local Authority Children's Services and Public Health so that they have a reliable database upon which they can objectively plan health care provision for young people.





Each questionnaire is anonymous and confidential, and no pupil will be identified. The Local Authority will only receive a summary of school data within which individual schools are not identified. We will receive anonymous data which will allow us to review our PSHE curriculum. The questionnaire will be taken by year 8 and year 10 students in the week beginning 18th March.
