

As part of our commitment to ensuring that all students have access to nutritious food in school, we would like to remind parents and carers about the need to keep ParentPay accounts topped up.

We would like every student to be able to purchase their food of choice and we appreciate your cooperation in helping your child understand the importance of managing their meal allowance effectively at both breaktime and lunchtime.

Please be kind enough to check the food account balance for your child to ensure that it is in credit and that they have sufficient funds to make the purchases you deem necessary. Accounts that are not sufficiently in credit could lead to a child being unable to make a purchase. Remember, you can set alerts on the ParentPay app to alert you when the account has dipped below a the figure you set.
