Dear Parents and Carers,

I do hope you are well.

Yet again, I find myself writing to you celebrating the approach our students take to school life. Year 11 are in mock season and they have been fantastic. We usually enjoy superb behaviour and cooperation from our students, but year 11 have surpassed our expectations during their examinations. They have taken every aspect of the mocks seriously and conducted themselves marvellously, we could not have wished for more. When students work hard for their mocks they benefit more from the whole process and learn valuable lessons about what works for them with regards to academic revision and personal resilience, skills which will serve them well in the future. I am grateful for the support we enjoy from our parents as we strive to help our young people be their best selves.

Year 13 have their mocks after Christmas, and although examinations can be stressful, I am convinced that year 13 will learn much about what has worked for them and what they might need to develop ahead of the final examinations in the summer.

There will be a series of smaller assessments for both year 11 and 13 during lessons in the time between the end of mocks and the public examinations. These assessments will help students prepare for the summer session as we know that practising, checking and practising again is a successful strategy for helping learners commit ideas, facts and concepts to their long term memory.

The CAP (Child Assault Prevention) team will be working in school in December with Year 8 and Year 9 pupils. Their whole morning workshops with each tutor group focus on keeping safe around peers, strangers (both online and offline) and in relationships. The sessions are empowering, non-threatening and enjoyable for the students and held in class groups, with a member of school staff present.
