Dear Parents and Carers,

I do hope you are all well.

As you know, student leadership is an integral part of life at Plymouth High and in my message to students last week I reminded everyone of the names and school email addresses of both our Head Student Team and also our Earth Alliance Team. Both teams are really eager to involve students from all year groups and would very much welcome people getting in touch with them.

February is national LGBTQ+ month. Lauren, one of our student leaders in year 13, is managing the activities and events that will happen at school during February to raise awareness of the importance of tolerance and personal choice. On the 11<sup>th</sup> February, there will be a Mufti Day with the theme *True Colours*, which is celebrating all the colours on the pride flag. To get involved, students can come dressed in the colour of their choice (red for life, orange for healing, yellow for sunlight, green for nature, blue for art, indigo for harmony, and purple for the soul), or they can dress as they would for a regular mufti day. However, Lauren and her team would be delighted if students embraced the *True Colours* idea.

We are excited to see how many students win a bronze, silver or gold certificate in the national competition as well as being able to reward the class in each year group with the highest average score.

Teachers are posting lesson material, including homework information, on their class Microsoft Teams account and many departments are making increasing use of online learning packages. The information posted on Teams is designed to assist students in their day to day learning and in support of their long term memory and assessment preparation. Your child can show you what has been posted for each of their subjects, I think you may find it really interesting.

We have been running parents evenings virtually during the pandemic and whilst it took us all a while to get used to it, we have noticed that many more parents have been able to make a virtual booking than were able to physically come into school. We are eager to maintain
