This year we will be celebrating World Book Day through a variety of activities in the library and across the whole school. We ask that students choose a character from the texts that we study, or from other works which are popular amongst students. You can find a list of recommended characters at the end of this letter.

We will be holding a house competition for the best home-made costume, and are encouraging students to make their own outfits rather than purchase anything for the day.

As it will be a normal school day, students who do not wish to take part should come to school in their school uniform.

The Masked Reader – some of our staff have donned a mask or disguise whilst they read one of their favourite books. Can they guess who is behind the mask?
