Dear Parents and Carers,

I do hope this finds you well and that you had a relaxing and enjoyable Easter break.

I am pleased to report that the library was redecorated over the Easter break in readiness for its conversion to become the new sixth form study space. We continue to meet with young people who are eager to join our sixth form in September and I know they will enjoy the new high quality and much improved study environment for their A level learning. Designing and planning for the new library in the current sixth form common room is underway and we expect to open the new library in time for the September intake.

This week has been one of our Quality Assurance weeks and we have been delighted to welcome thinking, teaching and learning experts from our Trust to work with us. We have been visiting lessons across the school and talking with teachers about how they help their students to enjoy their learning as well as ensuring they make the best possible academic progress. Trust colleagues joined us for an after school training session on Socratic questioning which teachers found interesting and engaging. Staff will be engaged in further Trust wide training on June 22nd 2022. This will follow a similar pattern to our March training where students will finish school at 1.15pm and teachers will set online work for the period 5 lesson. Unfortunately, we are unable to rearrange any after school transport for this day.
