Year 13 are currently working on their mock examinations and year 11 will receive their grades for the mocks they sat before Christmas along with updated predicted grades on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> January. Year 11 and 13 students still have some new knowledge and skills to master before their courses are complete, but they will also be thinking about their preparation strategy for the summer examinations.
