



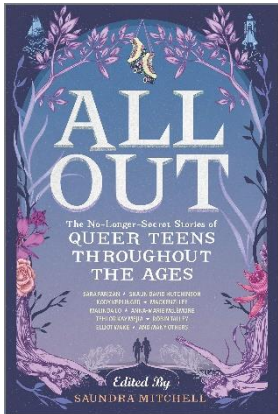
# LGBT+ History Month

These LGBT+ books for teens include everything from stories of self-acceptance to queer history. Perfect for LGBTQ+ History Month, Pride Month or any other time of the year!



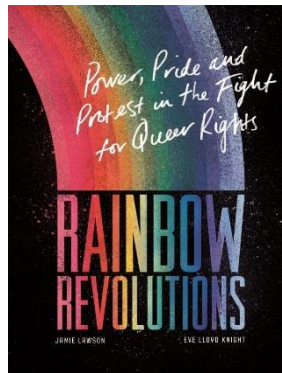
## ALL OUT – Various authors

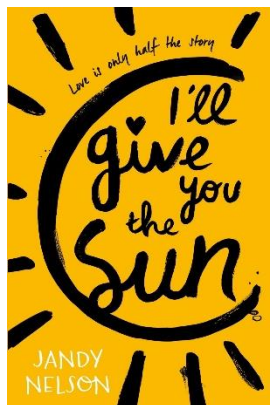
## Rainbow Revolutions

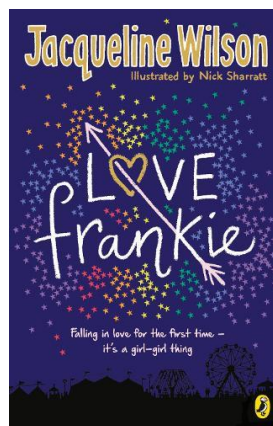
## I'll give you the sun

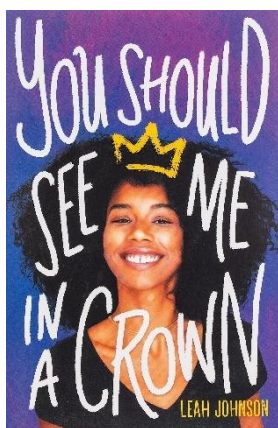
## Love Frankie

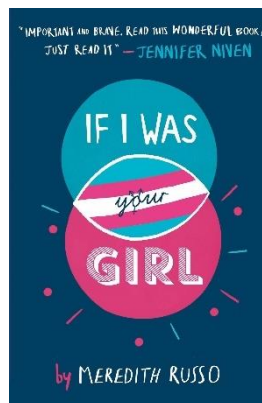
## You should see me in a crown
