Industrial action 2nd March

I wanted to update you on how we will manage the industrial action day on 2nd March 2023. You will recall that I wrote to you before half term to explain that we would most likely be in a position where we would only have year 7, vulnerable children and children of key workers in school. This is indeed the case for Thursday 2nd March. The reason for this decision is due to the number of colleagues that we are expecting to be absent as they exercise their right to take industrial action. Year 7 should attend school as usual and make their way to the Main Hall when they arrive. They will be directed from there. Other students attending on that day (parents would have had separate contact from Miss Barker or Mrs Payne about this) should make their way to A01 when they arrive. Students attending school should bring their knowledge organisers with them along with their reading book as these will be used if their teacher is not in school due to industrial action.

Students working at home will be provided with independent study tasks. The tasks will be posted on Teams. Teachers taking industrial action will not be setting work. In these cases, students are expected to make a sensible decision about what to work on. This might be; reading their reading book, learning key facts from their knowledge organisers, using material previously posted on Teams to prepare for assessments or maybe using one of the online learning platforms to embed their knowledge.

Parents' evenings

We have 2 year groups of parents' evenings coming up.

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Year 12 on the 2nd and 9th of March and then year 8 on the 23rd and 30th March.

We will email parents separately about the arrangement for these evenings, so please do look out for the email so that you can book your slot. Our intention is that every parent who would like an appointment is able to get one and I encourage all parents to make appointments for all subjects. Parents evenings are run online.
