
In particular we ask families to please note the following:

Afternoon examinations beginning at 1.30pm that are over 2 hours long will of course go beyond the usual end of the school day and so students will need to be prepared to make alternative travel arrangements to get them home as their usual bus or train will be missed on these days.

Families are advised NOT to book any holidays until after the 28th June. OFQUAL plan in contingency days for examinations in case of national emergencies.

Some students have additional paperwork as they have examination clashes or medical needs and this paperwork needs to be read, completed and returned to Mrs Hardwick as soon as possible.

The signing in and out procedure has been shared with students and parents and we ask that students maintain their current good practice.















Key stage 3 assessments

Years 7, 8 and 9 will be sitting their end of year assessments next week. Students will

not have an assessment during every period and will have the opportunity to revise

during some lessons, so bringing in knowledge banks and other revision materials

would be a good idea. I would be grateful if you would discuss this with your child

so that everyone has something meaningful to revise in between assessments. Making

good use of study periods is good preparation for assessments and helps to form

effective learning habits.
