Cars waiting outside school on St Lawrence Rd



Trust wide pupil voice committee

Next week is the summer term Trust wide pupil voice committee meeting. This is where student leaders from across all hubs in the Trust (there are Trust hubs from Essex to Plymouth taking in Kent, Portsmouth and Torbay along the way) present the views of the student body directly to the Executive board. I am delighted to announce that student leaders from Plymouth High will be part of the student presentation team, just as they were at the Spring term pupil voice committee meeting.

Sparx

We have now launched Sparx reader. Sparx reader is an online package to help our key stage 3 learners improve their reading comprehension, speed and accuracy. It enables students to improve, regardless of their starting point. Initial student feedback is very positive. If your child is in year 7, 8 or 9, please do discuss Sparx reader with them and encourage them to do their best to complete the set tasks. We continue with Sparx maths for maths homework. The system is designed to enable students to work at the challenge level that is appropriate to them.

For students to get the most out of Sparx maths and Sparx reader, they should aim for 100% in every homework. Thank you in advance for your support with Sparx.

Paint a brick

Next week there will be the opportunity for students to paint a brick on our 'paint a brick' wall. Students are welcome to paint a design of their choice. It should be an uplifting and kind design. It will cost £1.50 for 1 brick or 3 for £3.50. All proceeds will
